Course Descriptions

One Day Classes

Skid Avoidance

Era Horton, Eugene Ditter, John West—DPSST

All students in this class **must** attend the classroom portion on Wednesday, 16:00—18:00.

Skid Avoidance is for the Fire Apparatus Drivers program (SAFAD). This is a skid driving program similar to that used by the law enforcement community. The difference between the law enforcement training and that of the fire service is that we use a 20,000 pound Ford F-650 crew cab truck instead of a Crown Vic sedan. Our goal is to provide each apparatus operator the psychomotor skills and mental attitudes that are essential to becoming the most competent, skillful and responsible driver possible. This program is geared to reducing the number of fatalities and injuries during vehicle operations.

Class Size: 12 students

Requirements: None

Flammable Liquid and Gas Training, FLAG

Steve Roehl, Cody Goodnough, Jamie Mason—DPSST

The program provides the student instruction in the characteristics of flammable gases and liquids, method and procedures to handle these type of emergencies and the opportunity to practice use control methods when dealing with flammable liquids and gases. The program addresses the NFPA 1001 Standard Chapter 4-3.3.

Class Size: 20 students

Requirements: PPE with SCBA

Wildland Practical

Scott Stanton—Assistant Chief, Hermiston

The class includes line construction standards and applications. Using firing devices, safety issues, and tactical applications accomplished with a firing device. Navigation and weather instruments their use and operation. Hose evolutions in the wildland, burning operations and the use of fire for these operations. The class will include live-fire training and suppression techniques. This course will be a complete in-the-field practical training exercise with full wildland.

Requirements: PPE

Vehicle Extrication

Chris Mills

This course is designed to meet the requirements of the NFPA 1670 Operations Level Course for Vehicle Extrication. Students will participate in both classroom lecture/discussion and hands on, putting the lessons learned inside to work. Students will review new vehicle technology; including anatomy, airbags, pretensioners, and hybrid vehicles. They will also learn techniques designed to take advantage and conquer today's vehicles. Hands on will include scenarios with vehicles on their tires, side, and on their top. PT care and removal will also be addressed during this class. These hours can be applied to EMS recertification hours.

Two Day Classes

Farm & Industrial Machinery Rescue

Harry Ward, Rocky Desimini, Mark Ayers—DPSST

This class is designed to teach emergency responders how to properly manage emergencies involving machinery entanglements in various settings. The principals learned in this class have application to typical machines used on the farm as well as in manufacturing industries so this class is applicable to non-rural emergency responders as well. Participants learn how to anticipate and control various forms of stored energy and develop rescue strategies from various types of machines. Emphasis will be placed on teamwork to achieve the best possible care for the patient and property that is involved in the incident. This operations/technical level training will teach emergency providers how to efficiently manage farm machinery related emergencies following NFPA 1006 Standard on Operations and Training for Technical Rescue Incidents.

Health & Wellness Workshop

NVFC

The Workshop focuses on the basic principles behind developing a sound health and fitness program and trains first responders to become advocates within their department. As Health and Fitness Advocates, they will encourage and motivate their fellow fire and emergency personnel to adopt heart-healthy behaviors. Each advocate will leave with an instructor kit and a Fit Kit to take back to his/her department.

Three Day Classes

Fire Science

Jess Cooper—Lieutenant, Hermiston

Fire Service Science is an intensive introduction to concepts of chemistry and physics as they apply to fire service duties. Course delivery includes both lecture and laboratory demonstrations.

Fire Investigation

The Basic Fire Investigation course will be taught over three days with classroom and practical exercises and is based on NFPA 921, Guide for Fire and Explosion Investigations, NFPA 1030, and Standard for Fire Investigator, and Oregon DPSST Task Book objectives. The Basic Fire Investigation course will provide attendees with the necessary tools to identify and conduct initial fire investigations and scene preservation. The course provides a broad framework for personnel who have little or no experience in conducting fire investigations. The course is designed to provide high level of understanding of the need for scene preservation, legal authority, determining fire patterns, origin and cause and various steps in the investigation process.

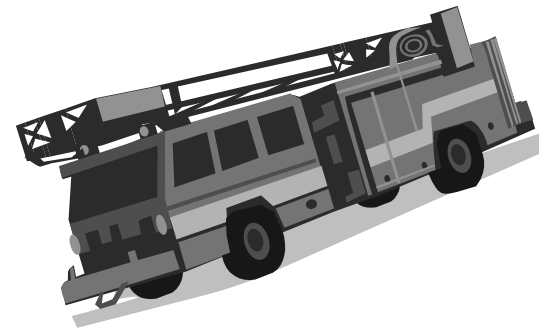
