Portland Spirit offers a wide variety of cruises along the Willamette River from Portland on a fleet of excursion yachts and jet boats. Also available is a Willamette Falls cruise, a 3.5-hour journey to the Northwest's largest waterfall (42 feet high and 1,500 feet wide).

North Clackamas Aquatic Park

The aquatic park houses several swimming pools, water slides and a rock climbing wall. Featured swimming pools include, a wave pool with 4-foot waves and both deep and shallow areas for play, a 25-yard, six-lane competition lap pool, a 13-foot deep diving well with one-meter diving board, an interactive area with cascading fountains of fun, a kiddie pool with Sammie the Seal slide for those under 6 years of age and a sizeable hot tub for those over the age of 18.

Slides vary in their journey from two twisting tubes of adventure to a drop slide for the more daring! Lastly, the Aquatic Park is not limited to just swimming. There is also a 29-foot rock wall.

Washington Park Rose Gardens

Portland has long had a love affair with roses – after all we are The City of Roses. In 1888, Georgiana Burton Pittock, wife of publisher Henry Pittock, invited her friends and neighbors to exhibit their roses in a tent set up in her garden; thus the Portland Rose Society was established.

In 1967, rose curator Rudolph Kalmbach wanted to establish a formal garden featuring Gold Award roses. With the support of the Portland Rose Society, Wallace Kay Huntington was selected to design the garden which was dedicated in June 1970.



In 1991, the Portland Rose Society donated the pavilion which overlooks these award-winning roses. In 2006, the International Rose Test Garden received *The Garden of Excellence Award* from the World Federation of Rose Societies.

Portland Aquarium

A new aquarium that will give kids a hands-on experience with marine life and other creatures is just outside of the City of Milwaukie. The aquarium is an 11,000 square foot building on a 2 acre site. It is an educational place where kids can touch the sea life and even help with feeding.

Every exhibit is designed for little kids to come up, put their hands in, touch the starfish, touch the anemones, have the fish eat right out of their hands and touch the stingrays. In addition to marine life (like hammerhead sharks, sting rays, fish and sea anemones), there will be the normal types of creatures you would see in a rain forest – tree frogs and exotic birds, for example.

Timberline Lodge

Declared a National Historic Landmark in 1977, Timberline Lodge is one of Oregon's most popular tourist attractions, drawing nearly two million visitors every year. This mountain lodge sits on the south side of Mount Hood in Oregon, about 60 miles east of Portland. The lodge was constructed between 1936 and 1938 as a Works Progress Administration (WPA) project during the Great Depression. Workers used large timbers and local stone, and placed intricately carved decorative elements throughout the building. President Franklin D. Roosevelt dedicated the Lodge on September 28, 1937.



Considered an architectural wonder, it's still being used for its original intent—a magnificent ski lodge and mountain retreat for all to enjoy. Timberline Lodge is an integral part of American heritage. In keeping with the spirit of pioneer forefathers, the area's Native Americans, and the mountain's bounty of wild flora and fauna, the lodge and ski area were built with the rugged spirit of Pacific Northwest individualism.

Join a U.S. Forest Service Ranger for a 25 minute tour of historic Timberline Lodge. Explore the rich history of the Lodge and all it has to offer. Tours are free and available to everyone. Guided tours are available 7 days a week at 11:00am, 1:00pm, and 2:00pm.



Directions from Monarch Hotel:

Follow Hwy 26 East to the Timberline Road turn-off (about 40 mi.); pass through the towns of Boring, Sandy, Welches, and Rhododendron. Turn left on the Timberline access road; follow the road approximately 6 miles.

Multnomah Falls

Located a short 40 minutes drive from Portland, the Columbia River Gorge draws visitors from all over the world with its commanding vistas, abundant wildlife, and majestic forests. The towering cliffs that form the Gorge create the backdrop for the Magnificent Multnomah Falls. This natural wonder attracts approximately 2.5 million visitors per year, ranking Multnomah Falls as Oregon's number 1 visited natural attraction.





Multnomah Falls offers a very popular 1/4 mile short hike to the Benson Bridge. Many Hikers with a little more time and hiking ability opt to continue to conguer the 1.1-mile trek to the top. The Multnomah Falls trail is paved from the base to the viewing platform at the top.

The Forest Service information center is open seven days a week from 9 AM to 5 PM. The desk is staffed jointly by the Friends of Multnomah Falls and the U.S. Forest Service. At the base of Multnomah Falls, the Historic Multnomah Falls Lodge awaits to offer a place of relaxation, a fine meal, the perfect gift, hiking or visitor information, or possibly an espresso or tasty treat to accompany your hike or day trip.
